 What is it? A double major program that involves collaboration between education and science or mathematics, intended to develop science and mathematics knowledge and the knowledge, skill, and experience needed to be an effective certified STEM teacher. A primary focus in a mathematics or science area coupled with education requirements in preparation for teaching the subject area: Students will be prepared to follow further education or employment in biology, chemistry, geosciences, environmental science, math, physics, or in secondary STEM teaching 	 What will I study? Interviewing and counseling, human behavior, social welfare policy and social justice, ethical dilemmas, diversity, social work research, and a structured internship experience 	 What will I study?
